WJA recognizes their responsibility to expand the number of students whose lives they are able to transform, with a goal to increase student enrollment by 20% over the next three years. WJA will provide expansive opportunities for an enriched student experience and will bolster services provided by their Office of Student and Alumni Success, to ensure that students and alumni are given every resource available to succeed.

WSG is committed to the joyful pursuit of excellence across every dimension of school life. They are investing in graduate support, student support, and teacher development, while growing school enrollment by 25% over the next five years, extending the reach of a model built on the belief that every girl deserves an individualized, affirming education.

ABOUT WASHINGTON JESUIT ACADEMY

A tuition-free Catholic school, Washington Jesuit Academy provides a nurturing, individualized, and comprehensive education to fourth through eighth grade boys from underserved communities in and around the Nation’s Capital. We support and inspire our students and alumni from enrollment through high school, college, and beyond as they find their purpose through education and develop as men for others who make a difference in their communities and society.

WJA’s extended school day and year—11 hours a day, 11 months a year—creates the time and space needed for deep learning and strong relationships. Students receive three nutritious meals each day, engage in a rigorous academic program, and participate in enriching clubs, sports, and after-school activities. Formation classes and social-emotional learning experiences help students grow in self-awareness, empathy, and moral character.

But the Academy’s commitment doesn’t stop at graduation. Through the Office of Student and Alumni Success (OSAS), WJA provides wraparound support that continues throughout high school, college, and into professional life. Beginning in seventh grade, students and families receive individualized guidance on high school placement, test prep, application support, and financial aid counseling. As alumni advance, OSAS offers ongoing mentorship, academic coaching, and career readiness resources such as essay-writing help and financial literacy training.

The success of WJA’s model is reflected in its outcomes: 99% of all WJA alumni have graduated from high school and 77% of WJA alumni have enrolled in college, compared to 62% and 36% respectively, of economically disadvantaged males in DC. More than a school, WJA is a community and a lifelong network that helps students discover their purpose and become agents of change.



WHAT SETS WJA APART



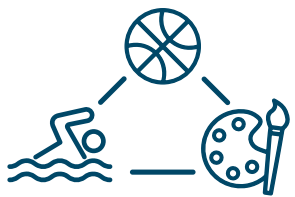
MORE TIME TO LEARN AND GROW

With an extended school day and year—11 hours a day, 11 months a year—students spend 65% more time learning than their public-school peers.



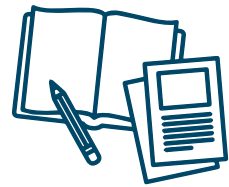
SMALL BY DESIGN

WHOLE-CHILD EDUCATION

WJA integrates academics with a wide array of sports (lacrosse, basketball, soccer, track), enrichment clubs (Robotics, Golf, Art, Cooking), and spiritual formation through retreats. Social and emotional needs are addressed through dedicated counselors and SEL programming.

OSAS provides alumni with hands-on college application support, test prep, FAFSA navigation, and access to paid internships and job opportunities, empowering them for success well beyond graduation.

ABOUT THE WASHINGTON SCHOOL FOR GIRLS

The Washington School for Girls (WSG) is an all-scholarship independent Catholic School educating students in grades 3-8. Located in Ward 8 and serving the surrounding communities, the school provides an excellent and equitable academic program in a supportive environment which engages families and the community in the social, emotional, and spiritual growth of its students and graduates. WSG helps students to become the confident, capable, and courageous young women they are meant to be.

The mission of WSG is to ignite the joyful pursuit of learning and inspire lives of faith-filled purpose, leadership, and service. WSG develops young female leaders by encouraging students' voices

and recognizing the individual gifts, talents, and potential of each student. The curriculum is faith-based, individualized, and culturally responsive. The school values experiential and inquiry-based learning and seeks to instill a commitment to service within students by offering opportunities to make a positive impact for others.

The WSG model is effective – since 1997, 99% of the school's graduates have gone on to complete high school at over 65+ local and boarding schools. Over 70% of alumnae have continued their education through four-year colleges and universities, two-year programs, professional certificate programs, and military education pathways.

WSG’S DIFFERENCE-MAKERS



ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

WSG offers a balanced calendar, small class sizes of no more than 15 students, and dedicated teachers who know every girl by name and by potential. Each student receives an individualized learning plan supported by one-on-one instruction, tutoring, and testing accommodations. WSG’s home at THEARC includes dedicated spaces for individualized learning, STEAM, wellness, and faith life, creating the conditions for a truly comprehensive academic experience.



OPPORTUNITY

WSG opens doors through partnerships with programs like the Washington Ballet, Levine School of Music, and the Phillips Collection, giving students a broad foundation of interests and identity. Through LeadHER, girls develop leadership skills via the Leadership Series, LeadHER on Location, and Girls Go Global, WSG’s international travel and cultural immersion program. Every experience is a deliberate act of expanding what each girl believes is possible for herself.



PARTNERSHIP

Education is not a solo journey, and WSG is a partner to parents and guardians throughout a student’s path. From comprehensive family and student support during grades 3-8 to continued support and shared community with their graduates, WSG engages with each student and every member of her team.



BELONGING

At WSG, belonging is not sameness. The school celebrates and nurtures what makes each girl unique, teaching students to approach difference with curiosity and acceptance. Students leave WSG knowing who they are and knowing how to meet the world with openness, prepared to move through a diverse and complex world with grace and confidence.



A LASTING IMPACT



- 99% of all WJA alumni graduate high school, compared to 60% of underserved male students locally.
- 77% of WJA alumni enroll in college, compared to 36% of economically disadvantaged males in DC.
- 72% of WJA alumni who begin college complete their degree. Nationally, only 43% of all males, regardless of socioeconomic status, complete college.
- 9 alumni in Military Service.
- 90+ high schools & 100+ colleges attended by WJA alumni.
- 485 alumni in 21 classes.
- 10 alumni employed at WJA (20% of staff).



- 99% of WSG alumnae have graduated from high school, compared to 75% city-wide.
- 65+ high schools attended by WSG graduates.
- Over 70% of students continued their education through four-year colleges and universities, two-year programs, professional certificate programs, and military education pathways.
- 75+ colleges attended by WSG alumnae.
- 383 graduates in 26 classes.
- 100% of the WSG class of 2022 have been accepted and plan to attend college.
- 6 alumnae have returned to advance their careers through employment at WSG.
